Subject: Enforcement of Parking Regulations



The Faculty and Student Art and Architecture Committees have asked the Administration to set up a means of enforcing the new parking regulations which were distributed on November 5, 1968. The following system of enforcement has been discussed with Judicial and will go into effect immediately, except for new registration which will take place as soon as new stickers have arrived.

1. All regular users of motorized vehicles on the college campus - including students, faculty, staff, special students, off-campus students etc. - will be expected to register their vehicles with the Student Personnel Office. At the time of registration they will receive a sticker designating by its color whether the car belongs in the resident parking lot(s) or in the lot reserved for non-residents.
2. The maintenance staff will ticket illegally parked cars and a copy of that ticket will go to the Business Office for the collection of the following fines:

1st Ticket - Warning
2nd Ticket - Fine of \$1.00
3rd Ticket - Fine of \$3.00
4th Ticket - Fine of \$5.00
5th Ticket -- Towing, at expense of violator

Violators will be expected to pay the fine in the Business Office within ten days of the receipt of the ticket. If the fine has not been paid by the end of that period, the Business Office will deduct the fine from paychecks, or attach the fine to the student's college bill. Any point of dispute about parking regulation violations may be appealed within ten days:

In the case of students, to the Judicial Committee
and
In the case of faculty and staff, to the Office of
the President

This system of enforcement simply underlines the importance of abiding by the parking regulations, given new traffic patterns and the on-going necessity of keeping roads clear for reasons of safety, fire protection and snow removal.
