

Bennington, Vermont, April 15, 1942 - There will be an exhibition of the work of Ossip Zadkine at Bennington College from today through April 22. The display will be in the Carriage Barn and on the third floor of the Commons building. Mr. Zadkine will speak to the community on Wednesday, April 22, at 5:10 in the Carriage Barn. The public is cordially invited.

Mr. Zadkine, who was born in Smolensk, Russia, is primarily a sculptor, and has experimented in this medium since the age of twenty. By freely accepting suggestions from Gothic and Negro sculpture and from the innovations of the twentieth century, he has created a whole field of expanded and enriched forms. Much of his sculpture is done in bronze. He has also worked extensively in gouache. The critic Wilenski has called him "the most agile minded and technically adventurous figure in the whole field of European sculpture."
