FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

1. The position of House Warden has been abolished and her duties taken over by the House Chairman.
2. Faculty are required to dismiss Truck Wardens from their classes at times of drills and fires.
3. Realizing the idiocy of requiring students to leave their Houses when there is a fire in Jennings, a change in the rules has been enacted. The rule now stands that:

EVERYONE IS REQUIRED TO LEAVE THE BUILDINGS IN THE AREA OF THE FIRE OR ITS ALARM EQUIVALENT.

For example, if the alarm rings 2 for Jennings Hall, everyone must vacate Jennings, the Carriage Barn and Faculty Houses; however, students and Faculty in Student Houses, Commons, Studios and Barn may remain where they are.

If the alarm or fire is on the West side of Campus, those people (Faculty and students) on the West side must leave their Houses.
