Hanya Holm, choreographer of such smash hits as "Out of this World" and "Kiss Me Kate" will speak at Bennington College, Tuesday, November 23 at 8:15 p.m.

The talk will be given in the College Theatre. A veteran of show business as well as a leading educator and performer, Miss Holm is one of the pioneers who helped to mold American dance. She was a feature dancer of the Mary Wigman Dance Company in Germany and later was selected to direct the Wigman Studio in New York. She subsequently evolved an independent school, using techniques fundamentally suited to America. After a long period of study she produced "Trend," which ranks among the outstanding works of modern dance, at the Bennington Summer Festival.
