Student Concert

Patsy Rogers and Kay Holmes will present a concert of contemporary music on Wednesday evening. The program includes two works composed by Patsy, an octet for wind instruments and a song cycle based on Howard Nemerov's "Seven Macabre Songs." Patsy has also orchestrated some songs from Arnold Schoenberg's "Das Buch der Hangenden Garten," which she will conduct at the concert. Kay will sing the Schoenberg, as well as a song she has composed from Rilke's "Das Stundenbuch." She will be joined by her husband John in singing the "Seven Macabre Songs."

The concert will involve numerous student and faculty instrumentalists, as well as some guest players.

Congratulations

Vacation Mail

FIRST-CLASS mail (letters) can be forwarded without additional postage and all first-class mail received at the College during the summer will be forwarded to the address on the SIGN-OUT SLIP. Please notify switchboard immediately if your address changes. SECOND-CLASS mail (magazines, packages, books, records, etc.) cannot be forwarded without additional postage. If you wish to have this mail forwarded, it will be forwarded to you POSTAGE DUE upon receipt. Forms will be put in mail boxes and should be returned to switchboard before you leave campus.

SENIORS should send change-of-address forms to publishers so that their magazines can be mailed directly to their home without additional postage. FACULTY MEMBERS should leave mailing instructions at the Post Office if they are planning to be off campus.
