Thursday, March 27, Carriage Barn Lounge, 8:30 p.m. Poetry Reading. Peter Kan Dufault will read selections of his verse. He has published in "The New Yorker," "Atlantic," "Harper's," "Saturday Review," and other magazines and anthologies. His books include "Angel of Accidence," "For Some Stringed Instrument" and "A Westchester Farewell and Other Poems." Mr. Dufault was the subject of a half-hour CBS-TV documentary, dealing with his poetry and life, called "A Look the Other Way."

Friday, March 28, Kilpatrick Living Room, 2:00 p.m. Theodore R. Sarbin, Professor of Psychology and Criminology at the University of California, Berkeley, will talk on "Towards a Naturalistic Theory of Hypnosis." Dr. Sarbin is currently a Fellow of the Institute for Advanced Studies at Wesleyan University and has been interested in hypnosis since the 1930's.
