EILEEN CARRIER

Eileen "Gatesie" Carrier, widow of Donald E. Carrier, a resident of River Road in Buskirk, N.Y., formerly a longtime resident of Bennington, died at the Vermont Veterans Home Thursday morning after a long illness.

She received her education in North Bennington, graduating from North Bennington High School in 1944. Later she attended the University of Vermont and was a graduate of Bennington College.

She married Donald E. Carrier at St. Peter's Episcopal Church Aug. 3, 1946. Mr. Carrier died Nov. 29, 1972.

Mrs. Carrier was employed for 25 years at Bennington College as a music librarian. In earlier years she was a longtime first violinist of the Vermont Symphony Orchestra, the Albany Symphony and the Berkshire Symphony. She was a longtime teacher of music in the Bennington and Middlebury area in the earlier years.

Mrs. Carrier began her studies in Bennington while attending school in North Bennington. In 1944 she was awarded a scholarship to the University of Vermont and remained there until 1946. The following year she held the position of music supervisor of Middlebury Graded and High Schools.

In 1953 she was again awarded a scholarship, this time to Bennington College. While at Bennington Mrs. Carrier went on a concert tour with the Bennington College Student String Quartet as the first violinist.

Mrs. Carrier was an active member of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Bennington.

Survivors are two daughters, Sharon Carrier of Bennington and Dawn Carrier of Rutland; a son, David A. Carrier of Richmond; five grandchildren, a great-granddaughter; three sisters, Lorraine Welch of Shushan, N.Y., Patricia Watson of Bennington, and Penelope "Penny" Hawkins of North Bennington, nieces, nephews, cousins, great-nieces, great-nephews, aunts and uncles. A granddaughter, Tara-Lyn, died in 1981.

The funeral will be held from St. Peter's Episcopal Church Saturday at 11 a.m. with the Rev. Kenneth Costin, rector, officiating.

Friends may call at the Mahar & Son Funeral Home Friday from 7 to 9 p.m. when the family will be in attendance. Burial will take place in the spring in Weybridge Cemetery, Weybridge.
