Jon Rosch (1956 -)

Jon Rosch, Theremin, Synthesizer and Percussion

(The theremin is an electronic device which generates an audible frequency. When a hand or another part of the body is brought near an antenna (or capacitance plate) connected to the theremin the frequency is altered. Since very subtle movements of the hand or body near the antenna cause very large frequency changes, the sound of the theremin can be changed from a very high pitch to a low pitch very quickly.)
