Re: Delivery of night milk to student houses

I understood from Miss Shelly that you were going to make an explanation to Mrs. Franklin about the change and discontinuance of the delivery of milk to students five nights a week. We did deliver it one night last semester (Wednesday) and I will continue to do this this semester.

My main reason for wanting to discontinue the night milk was because there was so much waste in this practice. I have seen crates of empty bottles picked up the next night by the delivery truck and almost always there were full bottles in the crates, sometimes as many as four or five. This meant as many as 4 doz. bottles of milk wasted each night. And there seems no way to prevent this. This adds up to the amount of \$134.40 a semester.

Underweight students have always had the privilege of getting both milk and cream between meals in the infirmary. Students on normal diets can easily get 1 qt of milk from the three menus a day in the dining room.
