All first year students who have not had a physical examination or who have not made an appointment to have one, should come to the Health Service and sign up on the Bulletin Board immediately.

So far this Fall there have been, on Campus and about town, a few more cases of flu than in the last few years. If any members of the Community wish to have flu shots we will order and administer the same. The cost is \$1.25 and only one shot is needed. The discomfort is minimal. The effectiveness is greatest two weeks after the immunization and lasts for several months.
