NOTICE TO MUSIC STUDENTS

New students planning to enroll in any music course must appear at Jennings Hall, Room 136, on Thursday, September 7th, at 4:00 p.m, to take placement tests in theory and related musical experiences. Auditions for entering students with previous vocal or instrumental training will be held on Friday, September 8th, at 4:00 p.m. in Jennings Hall. Students returning to Bennington and who have not yet had any musical work here but wish to enroll this year will have their placement tests and auditions at Jennings Hall on Saturday, September 9th, at 10:00 a.m. Students who do not take these auditions and tests at this time will be unable to enroll for any music work during the coming year.

Student Laundry

Student laundry will be taken care of by WHITE'S LAUNDRY on a cash basis as they did last semester. If you want your laundry done by them, leave it in the hall of your house each Tuesday morning. It will be returned the following Tuesday to the Commons Building at the office of Mrs. Winnie Knapp, the House-keeper, where you may pick it up between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. only, MONDAY through FRIDAY, and pay for it at the same time. Mrs. Knapp will collect money for the WHITE LAUNDRY for your laundry service.

Trunks

All trumbs must be unpacked as soon as possible and tagged plainly with your name, house and room number. Trumks will be moved to the attics on Friday, September 8th, and Monday, September 11th. Students are to bring their own suitcases to the attic. Because of fire hazard, cardboard boxes and excelsior must not be put in attics and the runways must be kept clean.

FROM THE SWITCHBOARD

The College Switchboard is open for regular service at 7:00 a.m. every morning and is closed at 11:00 p.m. each night. Between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. the night Policeman takes all calls that may come in to the College but is, in no sense, acting as Telephone Operator. He is not expected to put through calls to any member of the Community. The night Policeman refers any case of emergency to the College official who is in charge and responsible for handling emergencies.

In case of any emergency which necessitates the making of an outside call by a Community member, he or she will have to go to the night Policeman's booth to make the call, or to the pay stations in Canfield and Kilpatrick houses.

There is a 7¢ charge for each personal local call and all personal calls made from non-restricted telephones should be reported to the Switchboard. All long distance calls and telegrams must be

placed through the Switchboard or reported to the Switchboard as soon as possible. All telegrams should be written on telegraph blanks which are kept on the counter near the Switchboard and handed to the operator. Telegrams cannot be taken over the telephone by the Switchboard operator.

When you place a long-distance call which cannot be completed immediately, please stay near your telephone or notify the operator where you can be reached.

Notices to be Posted in the Store
