To Do's:

Create a general project timeline

- resubmit the garden/internship project by Nov 30th

- application/hiring process starting ?

Questions to answer:

- How is the hiring process going to be altered? sooner (start advertising at the beginning of next term, have someone hired by mid-term) One intern? or it could be two people apply in pairs?

- Can interns have other Jobs? How do we make it clear that this internship should be a priority?

- Where is the food going?

- How can the garden more concretely be a resource for students, faculty, staff and Bennington community members and serve as an educational tool used to develop knowledge of sustainable garden practices, as well as an experiential and self-guided classroom?

How can the daily work/activity in the garden be more structured?

- create a calendar of when things need to happen in the garden (this could be a part of a garden guide that we create based on what was done in the garden last year?)

How do we take Emi and Forest's garden notes/experience and make it usable?

- schedule specific blocks of time that the interns are working in the garden (ex: from 8am - 12pm 4 days a week, one 4 hour day is set aside for community outreach)

Volunteers

- create a structured volunteer schedule and protocol for how they can help in the garden, have a sign up/create mailing list towards the end of the spring term for students who will be here over the summer

- once there is food that is ready to be harvested, volunteers will be encouraged to take some produce from the garden, the interns will facilitate this process
