

MAC WELLMAN - damnable scribbler - has received numerous awards: NEA, NYFA, Rockefeller, McKnight and Guggenheim Fellowships. He has received three Obie Awards including one for Sincerity Forever in 1991 and the 2003 Obie for Lifetime Achievement.

Wellman dedicated Sincerity Forever (inspired, like several of his plays, by Old Testament Apocrypha) to the NEA's two most visible opponents, Sen. Jesse Helms and Donald Wildmon, leader of the ultra-conservative American Family Association. He complimented them "for the fine job you are doing of destroying civil liberties in These States." The AFA then published exerpts from the play without the author's permission, describing the character of Jesus H. Christ as a "foul-mouthed bigot", prompting the following from Mr. Wellman to Mr. Wildmon:

"A bigot, for your information, is a person who is intolerant, particularly of other people's beliefs and ways of life. It is you and not Jesus...who hates gays and lesbians, black people, Jews and everyone else who isn't lily-white, born-again, and xenophobic. The Bible is a great book, a very great book indeed; it was conceived and written by some of the most inspired men and women who ever lived. But you have ignored the whole marvelous textual complexity of the Good Book, and have committed the sacrilege of treating it all as some moronic tract like the Protocols of the Elders of Zion, a vehicle for marginalizing minorities and subjecting them to slander and vilification. I repeat, it is you, not me, who is the foul-mouthed bigot; and certainly not the Jesus H. Christ of Sincerity Forever, who merely enjoins people not to be "so goshdarned pleased with theyselves"\* and not to put "words in my mouth concerning they fears."\*\*

Subsequently (mysteriously), Mr. Wellman was enjoined by the NEA to remove any reference crediting the agency for their support through the Playwright Fellowship, the reason having to do with details regarding dates. Thus the following:

"The National Endowment for the Arts has requested that I remove credit to them for my play Sincerity Forever, although I received a 1990 Playwriting Fellowship. Accordingly, the author would like to amend the error of his ways: I was wrong, Sincerity Forever was not made possible by the generous assistance of the NEA. I don't know what I was thinking... Mac Wellman. 9/30/90"
