Health Promotion

Summer Storage

As the term is coming to a close, a number of students are interested in storing belongings over the summer. This year Bennington College will be working with Boomerang Storage Company for our storage needs. (Note: Bennington College will not be storing students' belongings on campus this summer.)

Boomerang will be providing two storage options over the summer. They are as follows:

- Boomerang offers door-to-door service. A professional moving team will pick up your items (which must be properly stored and labeled per their standards) from your room and bring them to a secure warehouse in Holyoke, MA. They will store these items for the duration of the summer and return all of your belongings to your room at the start of the term. Pricing for this option is per item, and you can find those prices here. Students living in Longmeadow, Shingle, Welling Town House or off-campus are not eligible for this option. (Note: we have secured a 10% discount to these rates not currently reflected on this website.)
- They will also establish a storage drop-off spot for students who do not opt in for the door-to-door service. The location for this option is Bingham storage basement. Students who choose this option will bring their items to the Bingham basement. Boomerang will then transport these items to their secure warehouse, store them for the summer, and deliver them to Bingham basement at the start of next term. Boomerang charges \$20 to store a large box and \$35 to store any piece of furniture for this option.

Boomerang will be operating both services on Wednesday, May 31 and Thursday, June 1 from 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm. If you are interested, please register for either storage option on the Bennington College page of the Boomerang website.

Note: students who will not be on campus in fall 2017 and who have items they want stored must work directly with Boomerang to make alternative storage arrangements.
