

TONE FOR TONE PROCESS

I wanted somehow to combine my photography and music; it only seemed fitting. Neil suggested that I designate certain tones of music/sound to correspond with certain tones in my photographs. From there, everything started to fit into place. I had been using "tone rows" to write music, so I started using tentone rows, which neatly corresponded to the "ten-zone" system in photography. The tones in the photograph determined which "row" of my graph was used; the duration of certain tones in the photograph, or their textures, determined the rhythm. As I became more comfortable with writing pieces for photographs, I composed with the portrait-subject's personality - as well as the overall feeling of the photograph - in mind .
