Ms. Pettitt's career includes playing the title role in J.E. Franklin-Ossie Davis film Black Girl and co-writing Palaver, with Louise Smith, a duet played at Performance Space 122 and Iowa University's National Conference for Women Against Racism and Other Forms of Opression. Her work addresses some of the most important issues facing our communities, such as voter registration, child abuse and domestic violence. Since 1985 she has worked in artistic collaboration with director Remy Tissier to create 10 original works. Women Preachers, a celebration of the oral tradition of the black church was presented in Franklin Furnace in 1990. Ms. Pettitt's group experience includes in 1991 performing in Lincoln Center's Broadway production of Zora Neale Hurston's & Langston Hughes' historical comedy Mule Bone, between 1991 and 1999 her major solo works include: Caught Between The Devil And The Deep Blue Sea - Tricksters; All Over You Like White On Rice - Wrapped Up, Tied Up and Tangled - Mollie Oil BETWIXT and Wild Steps, all of which premiered to rave reviews at Performance Space 122 in New York City.
