Any portable articles such as clothing, records, books, etc. may be submitted. No large pieces of furniture

will be accepted.

Articles to be put on sale are to be brought to the Gallery between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on the evening of June 4th. No articles will be accepted at any other time, nor will the Store Board be responsible for articles left in the Store at any time.

Tags provided by the Store must be secured to each article. On each tag must be clearly written the name of the owner, description of the article and the price.

All sales are strictly cash and nothing may leave the sale until it is paid for.

Nothing will be sold before 9:00 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. on June 5th.

Owners must call for all unsold articles between 4:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. on June 5th.

Articles not collected by the owners and not sold in the Rummage Sale will be given to the charity designated by the Store Board.

For articles sold, the owners will receive 65% of the selling price, 25% will be given to the Scholarship Fund, and 10% will be retained by the Store.

All articles which are in the Lost and Found cabinet at 6:00 p.m. on June 4th will be removed, priced, and put in the sale; 75% of the income from these sales will go to the Store, and 25% to the Scholarship Fund.

The Store does not assume any financial responsibility for reimbursing people for missing articles. All articles are entered at the owner's risk.
