DIRECTOR'S NOTE

A Lesson in Hate

"Restless motion is produced and kept up by the agency of two simple impulses-hunger and the sexual instinct; aided a little, perhaps, by the influ ence of boredom, but by nothing else; and that, in the theatre of life, form the primum mobile of how complicated a machinery, setting in motion how strange and varied a scene!" And my small hope is that they do the same for all of you watching tonight.
