Tech Tip of the Week

Google has pre-released a new suite of calendar tools as part of the Google Calendar suite. You can opt-in to the new system by clicking the "use new calendar" button in the top right corner of your Bennington Google calendar at calendar.google.com. There are many new features, but perhaps one of the best is the ability to create appointment time slots. This allows you to create a time block (say, 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m) and then open that block up for a designated series of appointment times (say, 30 minutes each). You can then send those calendar slots to a group and they can choose an appointment time. This might be particularly useful for scheduling events with students or members of groups -- for example, advising meetings.
