Re: Student Agency for Boston Herald and Boston Traveler

At their meeting of April 9th the Board of Directors of the Cooperative Store approved the establishment of a Student Agency for the Boston Herald and the Boston Traveler provided that the Agent did no open solicitation for subscriptions. She would be permitted to post information regarding the paper on the bulletin boards in the Commons and to send individual announcements to Students from Boston and the New England Vicinity. She would not be permitted to solicit subscriptions in the Commons such as the Agents do for the New York Times and Herald Tribune.

The reason for these restrictions is that the Board's policy is to limit Student Agencies to only those newspapers which have a wide appeal to the Community. It is the opinion of the Board that both Boston papers have only a local appeal and that those Students who might be interested in subscribing could be made aware of the Agent's services without the Agent becoming a nuisance to the rest of the Community. If Marjorie Hill and Miss Cannon are willing to operate under these restrictions, the Board approves the establishment of the agency.
