

Minutes of the Central Committee

The Central Committee met on December 15, 1941.

Teresa Blumberg reported the trouble in Booth house on Saturday night, December 13 which was occasioned by these girls. Teresa was called at 1:30 to quiet the noisy group in the living room. The girls and their dates were playing the victrola and being generally disturbing. Teresa called the policeman who came to Booth to break up the party. Ruth, Dorothea and Carol insisted that he go with them to Teresa's room as they refused to believe they had been noisy and wanted, at that late hour, to talk it over.

The committee discussed the advisability of calling these girls before it. Ruth Miller has been particularly careful all this term; has been out little and seems to have slipped only this time. It was decided that Ann should speak to Carol, Margaret to Ruth, and Teresa to Dorothea, since they are the respective house chairmen of these girls. It was felt that this situation is an example and extension of the general failing to observe the eleven o'clock quiet hour.

Sarah Moore

Sarah was called before this committee at the suggestion of the Health Committee. She has been a continual problem, refusing to observe the requests to report to the Infirmary for check-ups etc. After

she had refused to report for her Tuberculosis x-ray the Health Committee recommended that we speak to her. The committee asked her the reasons for her carelessness and Sarah said that she had none, that she "just forgot". She was told that she should be as careful in this connection as in anything else.

Room assignments were discussed.

The meeting was adjourned.
