Mail Service

The College post office in the Commons building has been enlarged this summer in order to centralize all mail functions under the postmistress. The incoming mail will be sorted and distributed into the mail boxes at the post office at 8:45 A.M., 12:45 P.M. and 3:30 P.M. Outgoing mail will be taken to the Bennington Post Office at 11:15 A.M., 1:50 P.M. and 5 P.M.

All members of the community when wishing to leave any notes or mail in a person's mail box are requested to place them in a basket tray at the post office counter and the postmistress will take care of distributing them.

Between 12 and 1 P.M. daily a heavy parcels post, express and freight package delivery will be made from the shipping room to all buildings on the campus.

Mrs. Viola Conley is in charge of the switchboard unit as well as the post office. The post office will also be open daily between 1 and 2 P.M. and Saturday afternoons.
