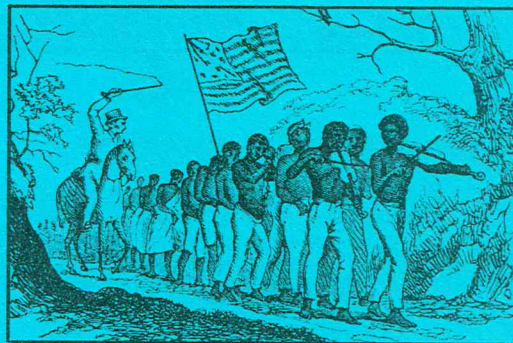
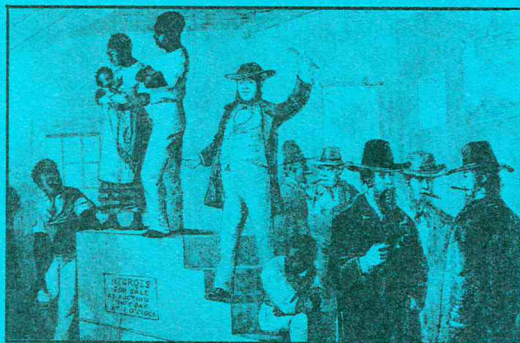


# Slavery Source Materials

**Slavery Source Materials** consists of books and pamphlets written before the Civil War by and about the Negro and about slavery and anti-slavery. The reprinting of these titles on microfiche makes available to all libraries 441 significant titles for use in either graduate level research or by undergraduates writing term papers. The price is only \$699.00 which is less than \$1.60 per title.

**Scholarly selection:** All titles were selected from the Negro Collection of the Fisk University Library by the staff of the Amistad Research Center and Race Relations Department of the Division of Higher Education and the American Missionary Association, United Church Board for Homeland Ministries. Selection was under the general supervision of Dr. Clifton H. Johnson, Director of the Center.

### **SLAVE NARRATIVE COLLECTION.**

[35-14] Typescripts of over 2000 interviews with former slaves conducted in the 1930's by the Federal Writers' Project of the Works Progress Administration. These typescripts were bound in 17 volumes (33 parts) by the Library of Congress in whose Rare Book Room they are now housed. The interviews are arranged by states with the following states represented: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia.
