FROM THE COOPERATIVE STORE BOARDCo-op Statement of Income and Expenses

The statement of the Cooperative Store
income and expenses was reviewed and dis-
cussed at the meeting on March 24th. In
all categories, the percentage of gross
profit was greater than the same period
last year, but the excess of expense
over income was \$984.63. The explana-
tion for the greater expense this year
was that there is a full-time Manager

this year and there was not one full-
time last year. The difference with
previous years when there was a full-
time Manager, the College paid for the
full-time Office Assistant. Under those
circumstances, the Store could return
some profit to its members. As it looks
now, unless we can think of some other
means of raising money, the community is
being asked to allow the Store to use
their ten dollar shares in order to have
the convenience of the Store on campus.

It is also probable that the Store
will not be able to pay dividends, aside
from the previously mentioned reasons,
until the \$1200.00 note for repairs done
to the Store last term is paid. Members
would therefore not be required to keep
their slips.

Mrs. Shapiro also announced that her
resignation as Manager of the Store
would be effective as of July 1st, 1952
or sooner if more convenient. Both
assistants (Store and Office) are also
leaving this term.
