From The President's Office:

Mr. Leigh received the following letter from the Hon. Lady Ward, chairman of the Dudley House Committee which is the English depot for gifts from America to Great Britain:

"In a letter which I received recently from Mrs. Gordon Wilson she told me of the splendid work being done by the girls of Bennington College for relief work for England.

"We wrote to Mrs. Gordon Wilson telling her how much the clothing and blankets contributed by Bennington had been appreciated over here and I am venturing to ask you to tell the students in Bennington College how grateful we are for their help and for their sympathetic interest.

"We distributed the supplies from Bennington immediately to people here who have been bombed and are homeless. I can assure you that anything for them that you send will be greatly valued and used to the best of our ability".
