"Hero" is a representation of every hero's archetypal journey. The show is based largely on Joseph Campbell's ideas of the monomyth hero, as written in his book, "The Hero with a Thousand Faces." Campbell expresses the hero's journey in twelve steps: The Ordinary World, The Call to Adventure, The Refusal of the Call, The Meeting with the Mentor, Crossing the Threshold, Tests, Allies, and Enemies, Approach, The Ordeal, The Reward, The. Road Back, The Resurrection, and The Return with the Elixir. "Hero" depicts almost all of the twelve steps, while leaving much to the audience's imagination of their own hero's journey.
