

The IT@Bennington team would like to encourage the Bennington Community to prioritize the "Bennington Secure" network in your network settings on your PCs and mobile devices; you may even wish to delete the "Bennington Public" network entirely from your preferred networks list. (You can still join the Public network manually if you ever choose to.) Prioritizing Bennington Secure will cause your devices to automatically join and stay on this network when it is available, which will reduce behind the scenes "switching" between the Public and Secure networks. For those who use networked printing on campus, this will likely reduce frustration with having to move between the networks in order to print.
