PROGRAM NOTES:

THE EVENTS ABOUT TO UNFOLD ON STAGE DO NOT EXIST WITHIN A CONCRETE NARRATIVE STRUCTURE. BY INTENTIONALLY DISTORTING PLOT, ETAF AWAKENS NOT THE ANALYTIC, BUT THE INTUITIVE.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES #1:

If I build a cabin in the woods. Cut, dig, stack. If I sweat, bleed, freeze. If it rains one night. Hard. Lightning, rushing, muddy, dark, hot summer. Water rises, floods, seeps through floor boards, surrounds walls, makes roofs into rafts, forest to riverjungle. If when the sun rises and clouds clear, water drops but mud sits. Windows broken, garden gone. If a cabin in the woods is manipulated without consent. What then do I.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES #2:

THE ROAD TO ETAF HAS ITS FIRST MAJOR TURN ON MAY 19, 2004. THOUGH IDEAS BEGIN EIGHT MONTHS EARLIER, A PIVOTAL CONVERSATION WITH THE DRAMA FACULTY DIRECTS MY FOCUS TO THE EMOTIONAL AND INTUITIVE QUESTIONS OF MYSELF AS AN ARTIST. SIX MONTHS LATER, ON DECEMBER 10, 2004, I PRESENT AN INFORMAL READING OF THE FIFTH DRAFT, A TWELVE PAGE SCRIPT WITH FIVE CHARACTERS. I SPEND THE WINTER MONTHS DESIGNING AND CONSTRUCTING A SET ON WHICH ETAF WILL BE STAGED AS WELL AS REDEFINING PLOT AND CHARACTER THROUGH WORK ON THE TEXT. TWO DRAFTS AND FIFTEEN HOURS OF AUDITIONS LATER, I SIT DOWN WITH FOUR ACTORS AND HAND THEM FOUR PAGES OF TEXT. AND SO, FIVE WEEKS OF REHEARSAL BEGIN.
