# Terms and Regulations

Any portable articles, such as clothing, records, books, etc. may be submitted. No large pieces of furniture will be accepted.

Articles should be brought to the Student Lounge between 7:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. on Monday, December 7th. No articles will be accepted at any other time.

Articles must be tagged with tags provided by the Store. On each tag must be clearly written the name of the owner, description of the article and the price. Tags must be secured to each article.

All sales are strictly cash. Nothing may leave the sale until it is paid for.

Nothing will be sold before 9:00 a.m.

or after 5:00 p.m.

Owners must call for all unsold articles before 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, December

Articles not collected by the owners and not sold in the Rummage Sale will be given to a charity designated by the Store Board.
