

COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING, OCT. 22nd cont'd

Recommendations for Registration Week

The list of recommendations by the Freshmen for Registration Week was read. The following important points were discussed:

- 1) Overcrowded classes have resulted from failure of students to sign up for certain groups at the beginning of each year. It was recommended that groups requiring signing up in advance be starred next year.
- 2) Titles of the courses have been vague because of an effort to avoid too rigid definition of the program so that any unforeseen alterations could be made. It was mentioned that an elaboration of these titles would not only prevent elasticity of the courses, but would tend to take the place of freshman interviews with the faculty. The importance of these interviews with individual faculty members is to be emphasized. It was suggested that the titles be added at the end of the courses, and that they be descriptive of intent rather than content. A bulletin including descriptions of the courses would be of value as a reference record.

The policies to be adopted in relation to the question of defining courses will be discussed further by the faculty.

- 3) The need for definite assignments at the beginning of the first week was decided to be part of the transition of coming to Bennington. The reading list already supplied is adequate.
- 4) Faculty advisers are to be reminded to be specific and accurate in recommending courses and filling out programs.
- 5) At the beginning of the year, house Chairmen are to explain fully the purpose of freshman meetings.
- 6) Asking an old student to come back early with the Chairman of each house will simplify the direction of freshmen to their rooms, etc.
- 7) The Recreation Council Party at the beginning of this year was not found to be successful in introducing freshmen to the community. Smaller parties for this purpose were suggested.

The bulletin of Information for Entering Students is to be reprinted.

Health Committee

The Health Committee has met with the Trustees and the Buildings and Grounds Committee, who have agreed to the improvement of lights in the library. A ~~sub~~committee, consisting of Mrs. Leslie, Mr. Perry, Mr. Tschorr, Dr. McCullough and Polly Stimson, has been appointed to decide upon the procedure to be followed and to have it approved by the trustees.
