Students who have a current non-academic ADA accommodation or students who are seeking a non-academic ADA accommodation (including ADA single room, meal plan reduction, emotional support animal) must have completed or updated paperwork submitted to Natalie Basil in the Office of Student Life no later than **March 15, 2018** in order for accommodations to be made as part of the housing selection process. Students who swimit paperwork after this deadline will have their accommodations considered but may not be able to be accommodated prior to June 1, 2018. Do you want to live off campus? As you know, Bennington College has a residency requirement that all enrolled students live in campus housing unless they are: 23 years of age; are married or living with dependent children; live with parent/guardian within 30 miles of campus and/or have an approved ADA accommodation. Students who feel they have extenuating circumstance beyond these reasons should submit an off-campus appeal form no later than **March 15, 2018**.
