Director's Notes:

In 1950 Fernando Arrabal was in Madrid studying to be a lawyer, however after a brief journey to Paris he resolved that he was going to be a playwright and leave Franco Spain. Upon arriving in Paris, Arrabal was struck with tuberculosis and confined to a sanitarium which is where he wrote Fando & Lis, his third play. He had written two plays in Spain prior to Fando & Lis, one of which would have won first place in a playwriting contest had it not so resembled the writings of an already published playwright of whom Arrabal had never heard: Samuel Beckett. Fando & Lis is the archetype for Arrabal's self-titled genre of Panic Theatre. Panic Theatre, as described by Arrabal, is derived from the Greek god Pan, combining vulgarity, comedy, love and terror. The translation of this piece is my Senior thesis in Literature, and while translating, I tried my best to sustain the dramatic language, but nothing has been more beneficial than this cast of patient individuals who have helped me hear the words come alive and decide what reads and translates into this language. I also must thank José and Gladden, two people who have supported me since the conception of this project and never let me down in their support of it.


