- Appointments: Since Miss Aue is away this semester, her place on the Board is vacant. The Board voted that Mr. Bradford Smith or Mrs. McCamy be appointed to fill it. Mr. Smith accepted the appointment.
- Hairdressing Shop: Laura St. Pierre works 5 days a week but has not enough work to do. She wants to drop one day a week. She would prefer to drop Tuesday, but according to the records it would be better if she dropped Saturday. In case of a heavy load on a Saturday, such as a dance weekend, she would be glad to come in. The Board agreed to let her drop one day and decide with Miss Steven which day it should be.
- Box Rental: The Store rents boxes to King and Company, The Bennington Laundry, and Overlea Inn at \$2.50 per year. The Board voted to let that arrangement stand. The Commodore Cleaners in Troy are very anxious to rent a box too, and as Cverlea is no too enthusiastic about the rent, the Board decided to rent them a boxttoo.
- Sales: Harpers Pazar is offering a special rate of \$2.50 per year to Faculty and students. They don't care whether this is handled by the Store or a felt Student agent. The Board that a student might be more enthusiastic about it. Agent will be cleared by Mrs. Grimwood, and passed on by Miss Steven.

Hummage Sale: The report of the Sall Rummage Sale is as follows: 175 articles

\$61 were made: the Scholarship Fund received \$30; \$12 more than last year were made; and more goods of poorer quality were sold.

Rebates: If the auditors' report is favorable the Board voted to declare rebates of 4% without another meeting.

Reports: The Budget and Balance Sheets were read. Also the July and August statments were read.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
