On receipt of your letter, we ordered enough of the blue silk material to make up a sample outfit for you but the mill did not have this in stock and we thought it best to go ahead and make the sample out of another color rather than hold you up, therefore, we have made it of a darker blue but in the same material.

I believe you will find that this material does not need weighting. We have used it successfully on several choir gown orders and due to the fact that your robes will be longer and will have more material in them, I'm sure that you will find it heavy enough to drape nicely without the extra weighting.

We are enclosing a swatch of the blue you selected and have just been informed by the mill that they have 400 yards on hand that they will hold until they hear from us. As soon as you have reached a decision, will appreciate your wiring us collect so we can in turn notify the mill.
