Added Field Work Term Fellowships

Returning students are eligible to apply for several specialized Field Work Term fellowships. In addition to funding, fellowships offer mentorship and the opportunity to be part of a cohort of students working in specific focus areas. A new Population Health Fellowship is available for winter 2020, offering six paid internship positions based at the Southwestern Vermont Medical Center. Fellowships are also available in public action, theater, arts and technology, entrepreneurship. All Field Work Term fellowships are listed on Handshake; search by job type "Fellowship" and label "Field Work Term Position." Applications for all fellowships are due October 11 at 5 pm.

Increased Flexibility in Field Work Offerings

With support from the Office of Field Work Term and Career Development and Faculty Advisors, students choose from a broad array of work-integrated learning experiences to "count" for their annual field work experience requirement. All of these experiences are designed to combine theory and practice, deepen knowledge and understanding, and enhance work-related capacities. Options for FWT include:

- FWT internships during the **winter** (special approval for **summer** opportunities may be possible; contact the FWT office)
- Fellowships in public action, entrepreneurship, theater, or arts and technology
- Eligible campus work
- Volunteer / community engagement activity
- · Independent study / advanced research
- Professional certification or apprenticeships

Adjusted Hours for Field Work Term 2020


