

A growing trend in the online game and app space is the ability to login with your Facebook or Google accounts. This ability to sign in to 3rd party apps using these accounts may seem convenient but the end result can be scary. When you click "Login with Google" or "Login with Facebook" you are often if not always greeted with a page that grants that app permissions to your accounts. This is where the fine print is important. You may be inadvertently giving total access to your account to a nefarious app. You can check what apps you have granted access to your respective accounts.
