HEALTH SERVICE

The Health Service is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. (3:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m. on weekends). A nurse is on duty when the Infirmary is open. During night hours, after 11:00 p.m., Security arranges emergency transportation to the Southwestern Vermont Medical Center.

A college physician is available five days a week during clinic hours. Appointments for doctor visits should be arranged either through the nurse on duty or the secretary.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING SERVICE

The Counseling Service is open from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. daily. Students wishing to make an appointment may call the secretary on extension 208.
