Ann Hamilton has continuously been internationally recognized as one of the most important artists of her generation. Hamilton’s astonishing body of work includes photography, video, and objects, however she is perhaps best known for her sensory and site-specific installations. These installations are famous, not only for the range and quantity of materials used, but principally for her unique vision and ability to evocatively encode gesture and meaning within them.

In 1999, she was selected to represent the United States at the Venice Biennale. In addition, Hamilton has created major installations for The DIA Foundation in New York, The Museum of Contemporary Art in Los Angeles, The Art Institute of Chicago, The Hirshhorn Museum in Washington, DC, Holland’s Stedelijk Van Abbemuseum, The Tate Gallery in Liverpool, and The Museum of Modern Art.
