About MCO 2109: Electronic Music: Creativity and Sound I

How do you compose when any sound can be used in music? This course provides a wide-ranging exploration into strategies for sound-based composition and the digital transformation of sound. Students will create original sounds and compositions in the electronic music studio. Students are expected to complete short readings, participate in discussions, present their creative work on a regular basis in class sessions and complete two studio projects. The lab session will cover digital audio recording, digital signal processing, and compositional practice in the electronic music studio.

About MCO 4139: Advanced Projects in E-Music

This course will focus on composition in the electroacoustic medium. Students may also choose to develop their technical skills in: digital sound synthesis, digital signal processing and digital audio recording. Students are expected to complete short readings, participate in class discussions and to present their creative work on a regular basis in class sessions.
