On Monday, October 27, and Tuesday, October 28, Mr. James Tenney will be on campus. Mr. Tenney is a musician who specializes in electronic and computer music. His stay is jointly sponsored by the Special Events Committee and the Science Division.

On Monday, at 11:30 a.m., Mr. Tenney will lecture in the course "Understanding Computers" in Barn 76. In the afternoon Mr. Tenney would like to talk to any interested students. For appointments, see Reinhoud van der Linde.

On Tuesday afternoon Mr. Tenney will speak to music students in Music Seminar, Carriage Barn, 4:00 o'clock. In the evening Mr. Tenney will give a public lecture, "Music and Computers", in Barn 1 at 7:30. The talk will be illustrated by electronic tape music. No knowledge of either computers or electronic music is presupposed.

Mr. Tenney is a music graduate of Bennington College (1958) and received his M.A. in music from the University of Illinois (1961). He has done extensive research in electronic music, computers and acoustics at Bell Telephone Labs. He continued this work at Yale University on a National Science Foundation grant. At present he is Visiting Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, teaching a course in electronic music and continuing his research in computer music.
