Force

Salem Art Works presents its <u>upcoming exhibition</u>, entitled *Force*, at Southern Vermont Arts Center (SVAC) in Manchester, VT. The exhibition features works from Executive Director of Salem Art Works Anthony Cafritz '85, Jordan Becker '06, Walter Dunnington '84, Sanford Mirling '04, and Enid Sanford P '85. Works will be on view in the Elizabeth de C. Wilson Museum galleries from May 8-June 27, 2021, with a closing reception to be held on Saturday, June 26, 2021.
