THE PLAYWRIGHT

(Excerpted from Who's Who in Theatre)

Sam Shepard (Samuel Shepard Rogers)
was born in Fort Sheridan, Ill. on Nov. 5, 1943.
He has written a number of plays produced at avant
garde and other theatres in New York, London, and
throughout the world including La Turista (1966);
The Unseen Hand (1970); Cowboy Mouth (1971); The Tooth
of Crime (1972); Angel City (1976); Suicide in B flat
(1976); Buried Child (1978); and more recently True
West (currently playing Off Broadway at the Cherry
Lane Theatre). He has also collaborated with Mich-
elangelo Antonioni on the screenplay for "Zabriskie
Point". He has received the Obie award eight times
for distinguished playwriting, was awarded a Rock-
efeller Foundation and a Guggenheim Foundation Fel-
lowship, and received a Pulitzer Prize in 1979 for
Buried Child.
