

Report of Recreation Council Meeting - Sept. 16th, 1940

The Recreation Council, at the request of the Meetings Committee, will sponsor the Primrose concert on Sept. 17th. The admission will be 40 cents.

The Entertainment Committee announced their program for this term. They plan to have a party in the Carriage Barn very much like the one last term when the Barn was opened. They hope to have Mr. McBride and Mr. Tucker as entertainers. The Entertainment Committee also plans to have a Christmas party and a spelling bee.

In order to have opportunity to do Red Cross knitting, the Entertainment Committee will also sponsor teas every Saturday afternoon. They will take place in a different house each week and will be from three to five o'clock. Recorded music will be played.

The Dance Committee had planned to have no admission fee for the informal informal dances and also no expences, but the problem of expence for extra labor has come up. Instead of an admission fee the council decided that the money could be appropriated from another committee of the Recreation Council to meet this expence. It was suggested that a college orchestra be organized to furnish the music for one of these dances. This will be investigated.

The possibilities of a horse show were discussed. Also it was suggested that the Green Mountain Horse Association be investigated mainly for the purpose of finding new trails for those who are interested.
