Test. There are also several students who have not reported on the result of the first and second tests. Unless these students report before Thursday, October 4th, there will not be time to complete the tests before the X-ray Clinic.

Every new student, unless she has had an X-ray since September, 1950, should sign for an appointment, regardless of the results of her Skin Test. In addition, any student tested recently, and with a positive reaction, must have an X-ray at this time. Also, any member of the Community may have a chest X-ray by making an appointment in the Health Service.

Failure to have an X-ray at this Clinic will not excuse a student from having a chest x-ray which will probably cost from \$10.00 to \$15.00 at any other place or time.
