#### CAPA Symposium

Perhaps more than ever people are trying to find ways to engage in meaningful discourse and public action. CAPA offers Bennington students a range of opportunities to engage in public policy discussions and to work directly with policy makers to make effective change. #### CAPA Symposium

President Mariko Silver will present to Gay Johnson McDougall '69 the 2018 Elizabeth Coleman Visionary Leadership Award, followed by Ms. McDougall's presentation, "My Pilgrimages to Understand Racism."

A lawyer who has dedicated her work to addressing international human rights and ending racial discrimination, McDougall served as the first United Nations Independent Expert on Minority Issues (2005-2011). McDougall is currently a Distinguished Scholar-In-Residence at the Leitner Center for International Law and Justice at Fordham Law School. In 1999, McDougall was a recipient of the MacArthur "Genius" Award. Among McDougall's many other honors, in 2015 the Government of South Africa bestowed on her the Order of O.R. Tamo Award for her contributions to ending apartheid.
