Brigid Capra made a formal appearance before the Student Council in defense of her performance as Chairperson of the Film Society. She explained the mechanics of selecting and obtaining films, the unusual circumstances which surrounded this year's selection, and why she had made her final decisions.

Last year a galley was ciruclated inviting anyone interested in working on Film Society to attend those meetings. The result was a body of ten people who out of 120 films voted on those films they would best like to see, established certain priorities, and helped to organize this term's list. Matters were complicated further by the fact that Brigid didnot receive the Student Council budget (they took an 11% cut this year) until late August. By that time availability of films was as much a consideration as anything else. She explained that as the school year draws closer greater demand is placed on the film rental agencies by other colleges and universities and that films become progressively more difficult to obtain. Only three films were selected that didnot appear on the original list, while selections for the Spring were postponed until a budget was finalized. Brigid thought that her decision to go ahead and order what films she could was better than arriving in the fall with the announcement that there would be no films at all for this term.

Brigid then went on to explain the tremendous amount of responsibility which falls to Film Society Chairperson. These responsibilities include the organization of that committee, the purchasing of films, the salaries of the projectionists and the maintenance of Tishman as a theatre.

Her presentation also included a breakdown of domestic and foriegn films, and emphasised that foriegn films are not necessarily less expensive that domestic films. She also felt that the difference between serious, "artistic" films and entertainment was an entirely personal affair, something for which she could not be responsible in a community as diverse as Bennington College.

Brigid concluded her presentation with her resignation as Chairperson of Film Society, and her regrets that this issue had been brought to such a personal level.

It was then decided that Film Society needed to be redefined, that delegates should be elected to draw up proposals to submit to the Council before a new Chairperson is elected, that certain constitutional revisions be made in order to prevent such things from happening in the future, and the general consensus that Film Society can not function effectively as a campus-wide committee. Jodi Kreskal, Jonatham Leitham and Jenny Kramer were elected as temporary delegate to keep Film Society running until a new Chairperson can be elected. These delegates are also drawing up proposals for the revision of Film Society.

Council then moved to the election of Committee Chairpeople. Sallie Stadler was elected Chairperson of the Health Committee, David Berman for Safety Committee, Larry Baschkin and Margarita Bonifaz for Food Committee, David Dubov for Rec. Committee, Erika Bundt and Bethany Stanely for Cafe/Liquor Committee, David Berman and

David Kirschenbaum for Library Committee, Laura Greenblatt for Housing Committee and Merritt Mulman for SEPC liason. Would the Chairperson of the Art and Architecture Committee please submit their name to the Secretary (box 378) as soon as possible. Committee lists will be in Chairpersons boxes by this weekend.

The organization of World Hunger Day was also discussed. Bethany Stanely asked that all Reps. take this issue back to the houses to help promote interest and participation in World Hunger Day.

The Chairperson of Food Committee asked that all House Chairpeople return their questionares.
