Bennington College Health Services will be offering their annual **Flu Shot Clinic** from 9:30-11:30 am on Thursday, October 1 and 9:30 am-4:30 pm on Thursday, October 8. While it can be a major nuisance for healthy people, influenza kills around 30,000 susceptible Americans each season, and we do have people in the campus community who are at higher risk for complications. Getting a flu shot can reduce this number...it's the right thing to do!
