President of the Cary Institute of Ecosystem Studies, William H. Schlesinger is a leading researcher in ecosystem science. Dr. Schlesinger's research on global climate change has been featured on National Public Radio, CNN, PBS's NOVA, and in *Discover* magazine, *National Geographic* magazine, *The New York Times*, and *Scientific American*. He has served as a high-level advisor on a wide range of environmental issues, with testimony before U.S. House and Senate Committees on a variety of environmental issues. This talk will focus on both the science of climate change and measures that can reduce its negative effects.

Dr. Schlesinger will present a more technical research talk at 1:00 pm, also in Barn 100. The title of that talk is "The global carbon cycle and the Duke Forest CO₂ Enrichment (FACE) project."
