NO SMOKING POLICY



The following policy has been developed to provide employees, students, and visitors with clearly stated guidelines on when and where they may smoke. It complies with State of Vermont Regulation H. 86 governing smoking in the work place. Smoking is prohibited in the following buildings: Barn (except in private offices), Library, Dickinson, Tishman, Carriage Barn, Early Childhood Center, and Jennings. Smoking is prohibited in all work areas at Bennington College including classrooms, non-private offices, hallways, bathrooms, rehearsal rooms and shared studios except in the following designated smoking areas: VAPA: open lobby area outside Usdan Gallery and Newman Court; Commons: first floor lounge and designated dining rooms; and the Maintenance Day Room.
