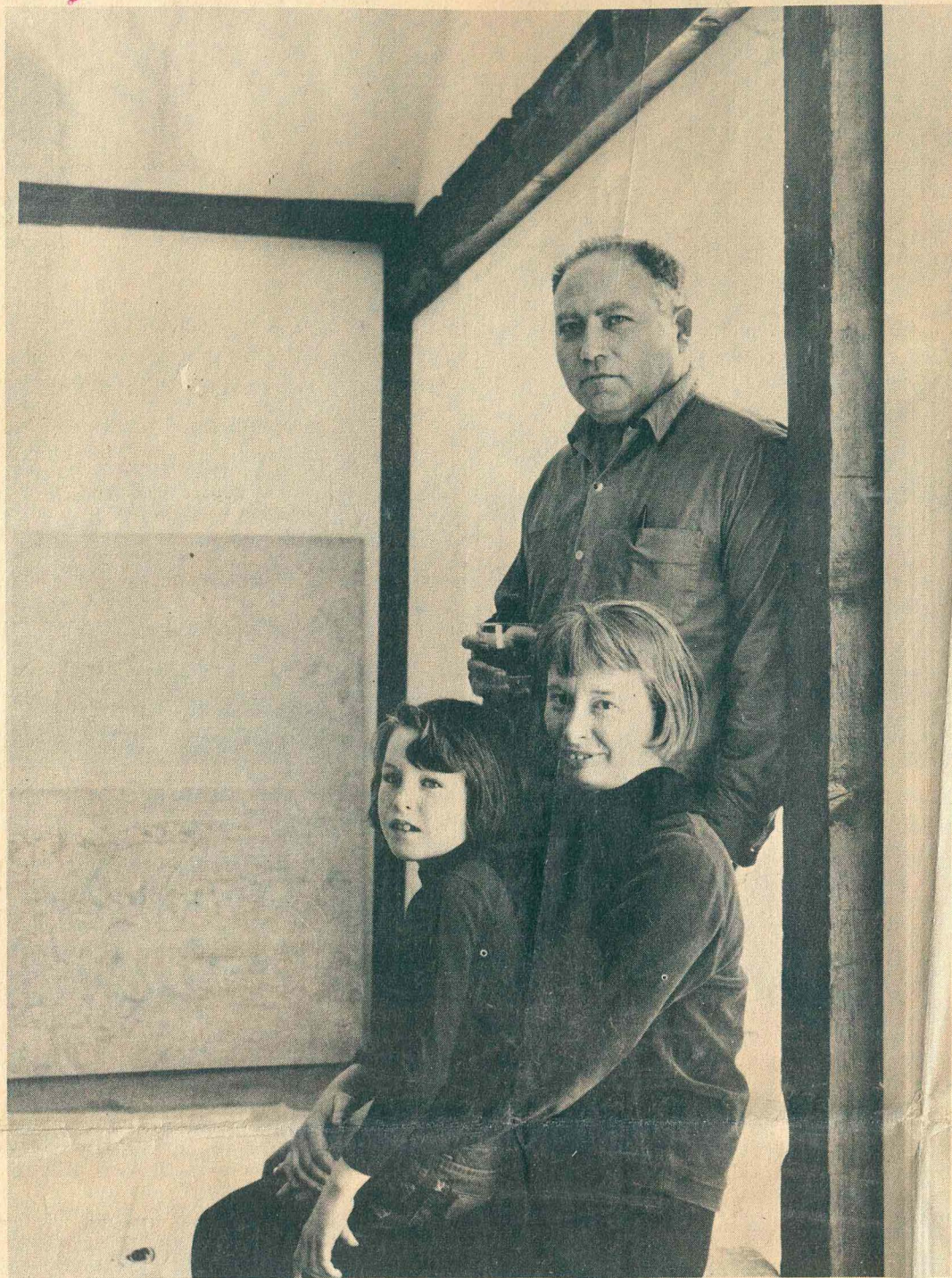

## *'Living with Art' Artists*

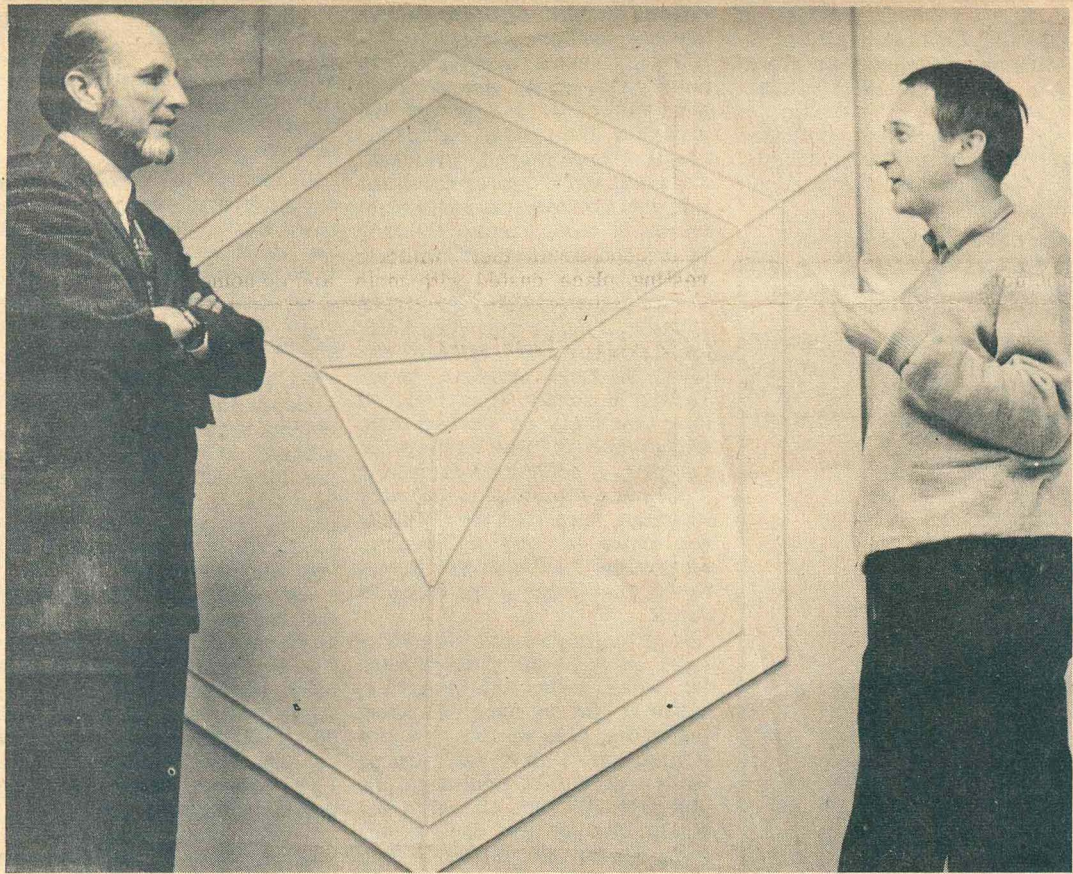

**BRITISH SCULPTOR**— Shown in his studio on the Bennington College Campus is Anthony Caro, an English sculptor who recently joined the college art faculty. A pioneer in new ways of using space, color and form, Caro's welded metal sculptures are bright, lively abstract works. His first museum show in America was held in March at the Gallery of Modern Art in Washington, D.C.
